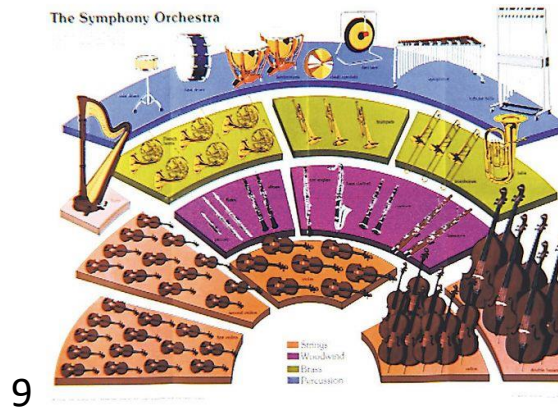


Music at Home

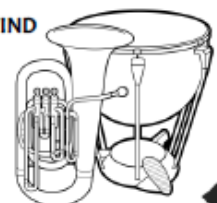
